

Vacation Pan Classes

Diatonic Pan Institute staged its 1st Vacation Pan Classes from the 08th July – 09th August 2013 culminating in a successful graduation exercise on 10th August 2013. The class was open to children between the ages 6 – 12 years and was an extremely enriching experience for all. We at Diatonic make youth development our primary concern and the result of these pan classes were extremely rewarding to us. The program was also used as an opportunity to develop our youthful members, and as such the classes was administered by our nineteen (19) year old steelband Vice Captain – Summer Balkaran and five (5) other members of Diatonic all secondary school students as tutor assistants.

A small fee was imposed for these classes, which was a first for Diatonic, since all our other community services to date has been offered free of charge. We were compelled to tag a cost to these classes in an effort to employ a competent children tutor in Mr. Roland 'Moose" Joseph, and at the same time provide remuneration to his assistants and the administrator.

The classes did not only teach the practical aspects of playing pan but also the rudiments of music and more importantly discipline.

Due to the huge demand for participation in Diatonic steelband programs, and in recognition of the part steelband plays in academic and personal development, Diatonic has decided to introduce a minors program. It is anticipated that this program will make an influence at a very early age and thereby create a platform for future success.

It is hoped that the relevant government ministries will become involved so we can offer the classes free of charge inclusive of all ancillary items.






We must be grateful to the members of the Education Committee who every week is toiling to ensure the readiness of these students.

Irwin Park

Irwin Park is being upgraded to what is termed a Regional Sporting Complex. This Sporting Complex is a Ministry of Sport Project, and is being constructed in Phases. Phase one consists of a football & cricket field where international matches can take place; a 333m cycling track which caters for use by amateurs and as well as for international cycling meets; a smaller playing field inside of the cycling track; lighting; a walking track; two pavilions with media boxes and concessionary areas and parking facilities. Work has started on schedule, and without any disturbances whatsoever.

The Daisy Voisin Hub

We applied and received permission to occupy 2140 m sq of state property located at the Junction of Bermudez Trace and the SS Erin Main Road, opposite the Siparia District Medical Facility. Over the last two years, we have been working towards the establishment of what we are calling 'The Daisy Voisin Hub,' named after one of Siparia's most celebrated musical icons.

Retaining walls and fence railings have been erected. A new public convenience is already in use and vendors are operating out of the new vendors' facility. The area is completely paved & public parking is available. At present, advertising space is available on the perimeter walls of the Hub. Another feature that is soon to be installed is a larger than actual size bronze statue of Daisy Voisin. The official opening of the Hub will coincide with the start of Siparia Fete 2014 which would be a grand celebration of this icon and the impact she has had on our community and the world at large.

Public Conveniences

Our Administrative Capital, Siparia can now boast of three new public conveniences. These are located at our new Market Facility, The Daisy Voisin Hub and the main public convenience on SS Erin Road, near to the Siparia Central Police Station. We have staff at all our public conveniences here in Siparia, keeping them clean and ready for public use. It has been found that people from all over the country are coming to Siparia just to use our Public Conveniences, another reason why we should be proud of the developments taking place.

The Siparia Market and Plaza Facility

Another major development within Siparia is the new, state of the art Market and Plaza Facility located on Lower High Street, SS Erin Road. This Facility consists of two levels which accommodates the following:



Rose's father was a leader with the Spiritual Shouter Baptists. Her family was very traditional and opposed her singing in Carnival Tents. She composed her first Calypso in 1955 after seeing a man steal the spectacles off of a lady's face in the Croisée, San Juan. In the song, she advises Tobagonians to stay at home, because Trinidad was no place for them. Originally she used Crusoe Kid as her stage name, the name Calypso Rose was given to her by the Spoiler, and tent members Piggy and Spike.

Travelling outside of Trinidad and Tobago for the first time in 1963, Rose covered the islands from Grenada to St. Thomas. She won the Calypso King contest and the Roadmarch in St. Thomas with her first recording, Cooperation. In 1966 she wrote the song Fire in Meh Wire, the first calypso that was ever sung for two years running at the Trinidad carnival (1966 and 1967).

In the mid-70s, she dominated the Calypso Queen Title, winning five years running (1972 to 1976) and had major hits with Constable Rose and Do Dem Back which became her first gold disc.

Rose was the first female to win the Trinidad Road March competition, in 1977 with her song Gimme More Tempo and in 1978 she took the title again with Come Leh We Jam. In the same year she won the Calypso King competition, the first time it had ever been awarded to a female which resulted in the competition's title being changed to Calypso Monarch.

Dexter Francis was easily one of the most versatile footballers in south Trinidad in the late eighties and early nineties. Born in Siparia in the sixties, this sturdy football maestro had become one of the finest defender to ever grace the field for Trinidad and Tobago.

His characteristic cool and composed style, effectively timely tackles, excellent reading of the game, accurate "long ball" passes, and amazingly powerful defensive headers made him a tower of strength in any team's defensive line up. Yet he possessed the skill, dexterity and creativity of any quality striker or midfielder.

Dexter's natural football talent and flair was so evident from an early age, that at sixteen years old, he was already playing for senior teams in Siparia and environs as well as representing South Trinidad under 19 football team. A mere two years later in 1984, Dexter was proudly wearing the jersey of Trinidad &Tobago Defence Force Football Team.

From then there was no turning back for this football giant. He won the hearts of sports lovers throughout the Caribbean and his football career rocketed. Dexter's achievements included:

ORIGIN OF THE STATUE OF LA DIVINA PASTORA



What is the origin of the statue of Our Lady, La Divina Pastora? Legends abound about where this treasured, historic statue came from and how it got here.

There is one about it being found partly submerged in the mud on the banks of the Martinique Spring at Well Road. At around the same time, ten muscular Venezuelan men arrived in Siparia, seeking a statue of Our Lady, which had disappeared from their village church. They came here because they were told in a dream that the statue was here. Try as they might to remove it from the mud, the ten of them pulling together could not dislodge it. Finally, they returned to Venezuela without the statue; but soon after they left, the village-people easily removed it from the mud and took it to the church.

Then there is the one about the old Spanish woman who, while weeding her dasheen patch one Good Friday morning long ago, chipped what looked like a doll hidden in the dirt. The doll bled, so the lady took it out of the dirt and dressed the wound. It became a young girl, who matured as the day progressed, until by evening, she was an old woman. The next morning, she was a girl again, with the same ageing process occurring through the day. The old lady built a hut for this strange being, and word spread. People began to visit and pray, and their prayers were answered. Later, after permanently returning to being a statue, she was placed in the church, but the prayers of the people for her help continued to be answered.

Some say that the statue was found among the bushes on a vacant lot in Siparia; others, that it was found on Quinam Beach, on the banks of the Quinam River, or in the Quinam Forest. Some even suggest that the statue may have been the masthead of a Jurao (Juarajun) canoe.

One thread runs through: that the home of this statue is undoubtedly the Church of La Divina Pastora, Siparia. At the time the statue was first placed in the church here, this island was still under Spanish rule, and the authorities, thinking that such an important statue should not remain in a small church in remote Siparia, removed it to the church in the then capital – San Jose de Oruna (St. Joseph), several times. But the old people say that each time, the statue mysteriously returned to Siparia. Eventually, they got the message. They left her here.

In the records at the Church in Siparia, there is an account of the statue being brought here by a Spanish priest, who said that it had saved his life. Was this one of the original Capuchin Missionaries? We do not know. Dating procedures done on the statue when it was refurbished in 2010, found that it was at least 350 years old. This means that it was carved around 1660, long before the first Missionaries arrived in Siparia.

Outreach Programme



Our work with Kalomo is now completed and we are looking towards orchestras in similar situations to assist.



Siparia Boys R.C. School

According to Dr Cuthbert Joseph in his book "The Life I Recall", The Siparia Roman Catholic School opened its doors in 1889". It started as a co-education institution, in a wooden structure, admitting both boys and girls. This ended when the Holy Faith Sisters established the St Brigid's Girls' Roman Catholic School. Siparia Boys' Roman Catholic School then came into existence on the 11th January, 1954 with Mr. Ruthven Brown as the Head Teacher.

The second structure was completed in October 1969, replacing the old wooden structure. Mr. George Dulal-Whiteway was, at this time, the Principal of this school.

Other great Principals and teachers have contributed to the growth and development of this institution. These include: Mr. Theodore Mc Lean, Mrs. Patricia Worrell, Mr. Stephen Daly, Ms. Merle Ahamad, Mr. Vincent David and Mrs. Catherine Teelucksingh. The school is at present under the leadership of Mrs. Margaret Ann Noel.

The school's Parent Teachers Association is a dynamic group lead by Mr. Theophilus Joseph, a supportive President who encourages all parents to partner with the school for the development of the school and as such their children.

The students' school life enables them to develop to their fullest potential not only in curricular but also in extra-curricular and co-curricular activities, which include football, cricket, athletics, Visual Arts, singing African drumming, steel band, Marching Band, Red Cross, 4H Club and Cub Scouts. One of the pet peeve of the students is planting and caring for field crops and ornamental plants.

The boys are spiritually fulfilled through the Roman Catholic teachings and their participation in various Roman Catholic Practices. There are daily morning assembly, scheduled visits to the Prayer Room where the Blessed Sacrament is present; there is also an Evangel Club that promotes basic Catholic Doctrines. Mass is celebrated by Fr. Martin Surju, the Parish Priest, on a monthly basis. Also, the boys with members of their families attend Mass on every forth Sunday, wearing their school uniforms and special clothing on Feast Days. The Roman Catholic Culture and Identity is visibly present in the school's environment.

The school has sent thousands of students into the world in every area of life. Many have made positive contributions to make their community proud. These include: Machel Montano, Daryl Henry, Ian Morris, Selvon and Shawn Noel, Njisane Phillip, Maurice Alexander, Norbert Samlal and Albert Richards, just to name a few.

As Siparia Boys' Roman Catholic School continues to evolve as a 21st century learning institution, the school remains at the helm of primary education for boys in Siparia. The name, The La Divina Pastora Siparia Boys' Roman catholic School, has been adopted but the initial motto of the school remains," Loyalty and Service", as the school continues to strive for excellence.





The Siparia District Health Facility (SDHF), located where the old 'Health Centre' previously stood, commissioned on Friday 16th April 2010. Since the opening of this facility our service provision has expanded to cater to both the primary health care and emergency needs of the general community.

The Department of Psychiatry now conducts weekly clinics, counselling on a daily basis and occupational therapy for persons in need of rehabilitation into the workforce. In the sphere of Medical Records Management, our facility continues to be the flagship of such systems. In addition, Pharmacy service hours have been extended to 8:00pm on Thursdays and 9:00am to 1:00pm on Saturdays, and our Primary Care Physicians are available 8:00am to 4:00pm Monday to Friday. The SDHF also offer the following range of specialized services – Rheumatology, Physiotherapy, Pediatric Asthma, Oncology, Ultrasound, Retinopathy Screening, Diabetic and Dermatology Clinics.

At the SDHF, our aim to meet the strategic goals of the South-West Regional Health Authority was done through increased levels of client satisfaction, improved regional wellness through primary health care, increased health technology capability, strengthened business and community partnerships, and customized performance management systems. All of which will redound to improved patient outcomes.

Our Emergency Department led by Dr. Clyde Barath and his team have embarked on a number of projects aimed at

improving the care of our patients. One such development is Thrombolytic Therapy for persons who have experienced a stroke or heart attack. This involves administering a particular drug intravenously to dissolve the clot causing the stroke or heart attack, after which the patient is monitored and transferred to San Fernando General Hospital accompanied by a Medical Officer for further management.

The Siparia DHF is supported by its Community Partnership Board, which is chaired by Mr. Mervyn Alleyne. We have also developed a relationship with the Siparia Chamber of Commerce which we look forward to strengthening in the future.

Occupational therapy – is the use of treatments to develop, recover or maintain physical, cognitive and motor skills which is important to an individual

Oncology – The study and treatment of tumours

Retinopathy Screening – A process for early detection of damage to the small blood cells in the retina which results from high blood glucose levels in people with poorly controlled diabetes.


